Break-out group work:

Groups of 6-8 persons. Each group discusses either topic a or topic b. Each table has a moderator.

- a) **ERA-NET Cofund.** In the view of the evaluation of the ERA-NET Cofund scheme by an expert group appointed by the Commission, the groups will reflect on the preliminary outcomes presented and discuss on issues such instruments, funding, supportive environment, embedding, and national engagements, for effective public-public collaboration and coordination *in the bioeconomy*. Both short term (next H2020 Work Programme) as longer term (next framework programme). The expert group is in the last stages of their work and will deliver the final report in November. The outcomes of our group work will also feed into the writing of the PLATFORM Policy Brief on Impact and Alignment.
- b) **Bioeconomy Manifesto.** The EU Bioeconomy Strategy and Action plan, launched in 2012, encompasses investments in R&I, policy interaction and stakeholder engagement, and enhancement of markets and competitiveness. Member States collaborations through ERA-NETs and JPIs contribute to making the bioeconomy a reality in Europe. On the path of the strategy review, several conferences and consultations of stakeholders take place, such as BEU 2016 in Utrecht in April that produced 'building blocks for the bioeconomy stakeholders manifesto' and the role of regions conference in Bratislava in October. The European Bioeconomy Stakeholders Panel, in which PLATFORM is represented, has taken up the task to further develop the building blocks into a manifesto and is committed to implementation. The group work serves to discuss, consolidate and refine the blocks that are of key relevance to MS collaborations in research programming and funding. The outcomes will feed into the finalizing steps of the manifesto.

13:30 - 17:30 BLOCK 2 – INCLUSIVENESS

Intro: This block starts with a keynote about the inclusiveness actions in H2020 prepared by the Slovenian NCP for widening in collaboration with the Commission – Directorate B5 Spreading Excellence and Widening Participation. Then results of PLATFORM’s surveys and of the Master Class on inclusiveness will be presented. These activities and the follow up through this session aim to engage the community in exploring ways to attract and engage the countries that do not participate in ERA-NET actions or do so only in a limited way. Through the surveys in the projects task on Fostering Inclusiveness, the performance was assessed of the so-called "low performing countries" (LPCs - as defined in the Spreading Excellence and Widening Participation Programme of H2020). Identifying among them good performers in the bioeconomy ERA-NETs, PLATFORM uses their experience as a positive example when targeting those countries that continue to perform low. The Master Class, held in May in Vienna, provided programme funders and manager from LPCs with guidance on how to get actively involved in bioeconomy related collaboration actions, and showcased how P2PS can address the issue of inclusiveness. This block builds on the findings and outcomes so far. Results will feed into the PLATFORM Policy Brief on Inclusiveness, and a debrief meeting with the director of RTD B5.

9:00 - 12:00 BLOCK 3 – INNOVATION AND EXPLOITATION STRATEGIES

Intro: Many ERA-NETs are increasingly funding applied research, performing activities for industry interaction and looking into IPR and other technology transfer related issues. But what is the role of ERA-NETs in the European innovation landscape, what other complementary initiatives exist and in what way could ERA-NETs interact with them, also in the search of synergies?

The block aims to give participants a look into a wider innovation landscape in which ERA-NETs can play an important role on the lower technology readiness levels, especially if they know the possibilities that exist beyond the scope of their activities. The ProBio project will be introduced and their experiences with helping research projects and researchers on their path to various forms of what is often called ‘valorisation’. Next, views and experiences from research and industry perspective on the uptake of bioeconomy R&D results towards the market, the policy making, and the society will be provided through a set of case presentations.
