BLOCK 2 – Co-creation and Responsible Research

Background document(s): Document describing EIP-AGRI basics and the tools: thematic network, multi-actor project, focus group and operational group

This block is co-organised with the Service Point for the European Innovation Partnership for Agricultural Productivity and Sustainability (EIP-AGRI).

This block will address the topic of co-creation and responsible research. Participants will learn about what is co-creation and what is responsible research and where these concepts come from, what is the aim, why to go for this? An overview of the EIP-AGRI basics will be presented as well as the activities of its Service Point. An interactive discussion in groups is included in this block. It will focus on the EIP-AGRI tools, each tool explained/illustrated by a case study, and what they could mean for the P2P Networks. How could the networks benefit or learn? What would be the challenges? How could P2P Networks results feed into EIP-AGRI tools? After the break the block will continue with presentations illustrating stakeholder engagement in ERA-NET funded research projects and in JPIs. The block will be concluded with a presentation on EIP-AGRI events that create, support and boost the EIP-AGRI network.

BLOCK 3 – P2P - ERA-NETs Community internationalisation

Background document(s): GPC paper “GPC opinion on the future of Joint Programming Process” (for adoption on the agenda of ERAC-GPC meeting of 6 June 2017), International Bioeconomy Forum concept note, PLATFORM Annual Event 2015 Berlin report

The block will address the horizontal issue of internationalisation and collaboration with partners beyond Europe in P2P networks. This is one of the 6 key indicators in a paper (for adoption on the agenda of ERAC-GPC meeting of 6 June 2017) of the High Level Group for Joint Programming (GPC), and there are many good practices already in bioeconomy P2Ps. The community needs to evolve as future P2P instrument looking at the new framework programme as well. The internationalisation has already been approached in the first Annual Event looking at those P2Ps that were specifically for international collaboration (INCO-Nets) and at international partners in ‘normal’ ERA-NETs. Now the approach is to listen to representatives of foreign countries in P2P networks about their experience, how to promote partnership and design proper tools for the future FP9.
